


## Step 1:

Sketch two triangles to form the shell. Draw small enough so that you have enough room on the paper for the rest of the crab.




## Step 2:

Use ovals to form the first set of appendages. Use triangles to form the craws. Use circles for the eyes.


#### Tip:

Sketch lightly in pencil so it is easy to erase later.




## Step 3:

Use ovals and triangles to form the remaining appendages. There will be 10 in all including the front claws.




#### Step 4:

Use the sketch as a guide to inking the final image. Start with the shell and eyes.



## Step 5:

Ink the first set of appendages. Use this time as an opportunity to make changes. Notice the right claw is up higher than in the original sketch?




#### Step 6:

Ink the remaining appendages.

# Tip:


Take your time inking. You can no longer erase

mistakes!



## Step 7:

Add detail to the shell and claws. This makes the crab look more 3-dimensional.



# Step 8:

Carefully erase the pencil sketch so that the final ink drawing is all that remains.
